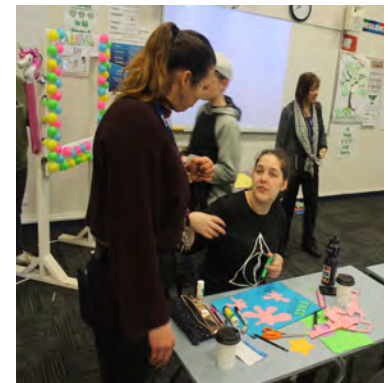

This year an assistance and extension Mathematics program was offered after school hours. These were well attended and students who participated are applauded for taking the time to expand their Mathematics knowledge and gratitude.

HUMANITIES

A team of legal observers mull over their day of observation in the County Court. They discuss how delays in the legal system can affect outcomes of cases. All agree it has been great to gain further insights after speaking to judges and tipstaff.

From a hilltop, a group of urban planners survey a nearby beach. They consider a new management plan for the area, which will involve building an access road and developing strategies to protect dunes and ensure beach-goer safety. Archaeologists in Mooroolbark examine recovered pieces of pottery. Whilst piecing them together, they discuss whether the fragments were once part of an ancient Roman bowl.

These were just some of the amazing experiences had by Humanities students in 2019. In History, Geography and Commerce subjects, our classes explored the nature of societies and environments, as well as associated issues, predictions, investigative projects, practical activities, workplaces, career options, excursions to fascinating places and much, much more.



The Humanities bring us closer understanding our complex world and the exciting possibilities it contains for our future.

Also significant this year were the departures of two dedicated Humanities teachers. Many students, present and past, have been enthralled and inspired in their classrooms. Maxine McGregor (who retired mid-year) has been passionate about history, generous with her advice and resources to colleagues, committed to her students, and always prepared to stand up for her beliefs. Robyn Cooper (currently on leave) has been a highly respected teacher of Geography, noted for the strong relationships she built with staff and students, and who many times demonstrated she could do things in the classroom that few others could achieve. We wish both Maxine and Robyn the very best in their future journeys, and gratitude.

SCIENCE

Franklin and Sheldon, our resident turtles have continued to grow and thrive this year. We were also excited to find out their genders! Franklin, our always hungry, big one is female and our quiet and gentle Sheldon is male. Our Stick Insect breeding program was very successful with approximately 1000 babies born this year alone. Many of our students and local primary schools have helped by adopting them.

This year we celebrated the 50th Anniversary of the first person to walk on the Moon with lunchtime activities of building rockets and launching them, making their own Moon cake pops and creating their own circuit using the interactive Gravitrax system.

Year 10 Forensics students visited the Victoria Police Museum. They examined a mock crime scene and used their forensic knowledge worked together to investigate the evidence presented and solve the crime.

In Unit 1 Biology, students attended the Zoo to observe the behaviours of the Southern Corroboree Frog, Philippines Crocodile and Asian Elephants and find out what is being done to ensure their long-term survival



in the wild. Our students in Unit 4 Biology visited the Gene Technology Access Centre and performed experiments using gel electrophoresis to separate DNA and then investigate the outbreak of a pathogen.

Unit 2 Psychology students ventured out to Melbourne University, to document Visual Perception Constancies, Gestalt Principles and Depth Perception Cues and visit the Dax Centre. The centre is one of four art therapy exhibits in the world and extended the student's understanding of mental health and therapies.

Unit 2 Physics students pondered, 'What Are Stars?' at the Victorian Space Science Education Centre where they used software tools to measure their distances, composition and temperatures. Unit 3 Physics students found out just 'How Fast Things Can Go' at Luna Park, joining hundreds of other VCE Physics students in relating key motion concepts to amusement rides.

PE AND HEALTH

Duke of Edinburgh isn't just a class; it's an experience and a qualification. To complete the Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award, each student has to complete 3 months (minimum 1 hour per week) of Physical Recreation, a new individual Skill, Community Service (volunteering) and 2 Adventurous Journeys. The 2019 Year 9 Duke of Edinburgh team developed their leadership and initiative skills both in and out of the classroom. They have bonded very well as a group and their determination and commitment to the subject has shown that they have the potential to make great leaders in the future.

We took part in activities such as Mt Evelyn to Warburton Bike ride on Warby Trail, a Commando course, a practice hike session at 1000 steps, a 3 day/2 night camp in the Cathedral Ranges (practice journey), a Wheelchair basketball game after an educational session with a disabled athlete, a level 1 First Aid course, and the overall highlight - our qualifying journey (3 days/2 nights) to Wilsons Prom. Thanks again to Mr Van Keulen and Miss Hubben for coming with us.

The overall idea of the class is for students to develop themselves to become the best person they can be, now and for the future. Each student in the 2019 class has done this. They have been a joy to teach and I wish them all the very best for the future endeavours. Remember: E (Energy) A (Attitude) T (Technique) like a Duke and you give yourself the chance to BE YOUR BEST! The Mooroolbark College Year 10 Talented Sports Program was designed to allow our successful and aspiring athletes to work on and further develop their passion and ability for their sport inside school whilst still finding a balance with importance of their overall education.

We participated in a number of drills and activities that can be transferable throughout many sports and we also completed a number of physically demanding and challenging training sessions. Throughout the year the students developed their leadership skills, teamwork, confidence, self-esteem, and respect. All vital factors in an elite athlete. We completed four F45 training sessions at F45 Chirnside Park. Some students commented that these were the hardest sessions they have done and surprised themselves at what



they could achieve. We also completed a tour and athlete education session at the Victorian Institute of Sport at Olympic Park. We then had a highly educational follow up session at school with 2 Melbourne Vixen netballers. I congratulate all of our 2019 Talented Sports Program team and wish them all the best as they strive to achieve their goals and dreams going forward. The entire group also tried to use chopsticks and tested out their language skills to greet and order food in the restaurant. 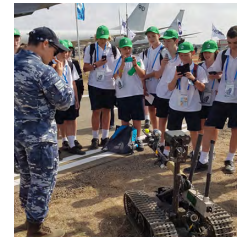
STEM
