HUMANITIES



- Fabulous megacity assignments students worked online to create the most insightful presentations on characteristics of the world's largest cities, their issues and management solutions (Year 8 Geography).

SCIENCE





This year looked very different to past years in Science. Physics students spent time exploring concepts and completing the practical components through online simulations, such as using PhET and Desmos. Our staff also learnt how to use more digital media in order to teach more effectively and these facts combined allowed students and staff to run one of their CATs wholly online using Education Perfect. It has been such a success, that it is our understanding that it is even being rolled out across other faculties at MC in 2021.

We must not forget that despite the obstacles we faced in 2020, we were happy to maintain one routine: Our students once again excelled in the EP online World Championships in Term 2. MC excelled in German and overall came 27th out of 1186 competing schools. 






















































































































































































YEAR 7 FOREST EDGE CAMP

STEAM

In 2020 a STEAM initiative has grown within Mooroolbark College. It has taken the shape of our new building, the Discovery Centre. As the name suggests it is a place for students to discover and actively apply their learning.

We are excited to see our Discovery Centre open in December ready for classes for 2021. The centre has been custom designed to foster and accommodate an active application of learning. Each learning space is unique allowing for students to immerse themselves creatively. There is a STEAM lab, presentation suite, green screen room and collaborative classrooms that can interlink.

Within our Discovery Centre we aim to foster a 'Design Thinking process,' an environment where students can apply their creative processes, applying different knowledge sets, mindsets, skillsets and toolsets.



Across 2020 students have had the opportunity to participate in remote STEAM initiatives. Students enjoyed working with the Yarra Ranges Tech School completing on line courses. During this time, we worked closely with Tech School and Deakin University supporting Pre-service teachers to work alongside our students remotely. This collaboration opportunity for emerging teachers covered key learning areas within the college - Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics, Humanities, Arts and Social Science. The importance of cross curriculum cooperation was a key part of programs and the underlying Human Centred Design Thinking process.









What an inspiring live teleconference this was. Female students from Mooroolbark College ranging from Year 8 to 11 participated in a live event with a focus towards Women in STEM careers. They were able to hear about what steps they can take to reach great heights in careers in Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths.
















CROSS COUNTRY—


RED HOUSE


GREEN HOUSE


