Throughout the year, the learning has continued, and the community has continued to grow and develop.

Naming of the College Houses

I am pleased to announce that from 2022 the College Houses will be known by new official names whilst keeping their traditional mascots. These names have been developed with an enormous amount of community consultation.

I would like to thank the Wurundjeri Land Council for granting permission to use these names and to Simone Thomson for the

creation of the wonderful artwork and the stories behind each name.

Baan - Water - Blue House

Waa the Crow is the Keeper of Wind and Water. He flies above the calm sacred waterways of the Birrarung, the river of mists and shadows (Yarra River) ensuring all creatures live in harmony with and look after the environment. A family of long neck turtles, a cod and platypus inhabit the waters with respect and compassion. Although these animals have individual personalities and traits, they work together in creating an inclusive, well-balanced and supportive place for all.

A bark canoe sits afloat carved with special markings. The markings represent strength in community and student determination, the canoe is carved from the manna gum tree - this tree reflects the connection of the school on Wurundjeri country.

Ngawan - Sun - Yellow House

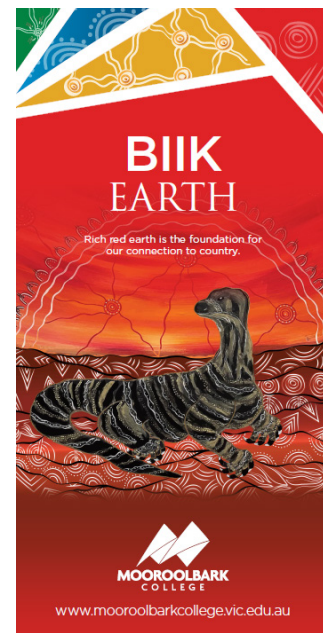
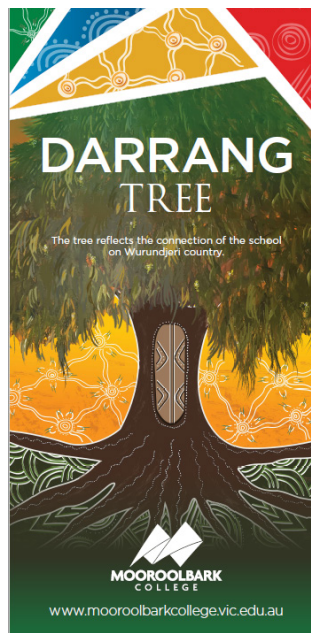
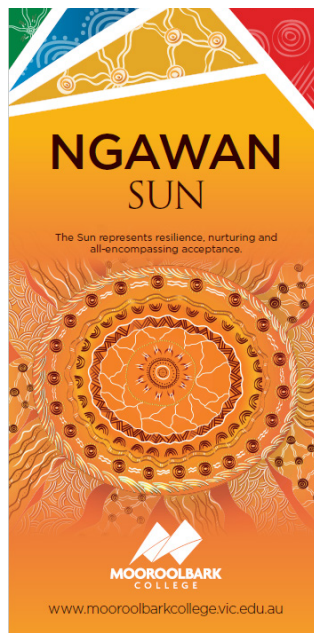
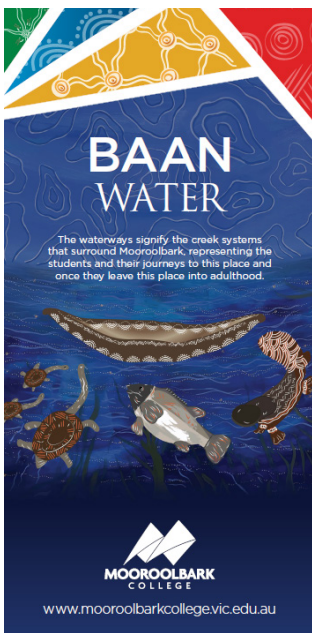
The Sun is the giver of life. It's positive vibrant energy, warmth and light nourishes the earth for growth. For thousands and thousands of years Aboriginal people have used the position of the sun in the sky for mapping and seasonal calendars. The Sun represents resilience, nurturing and all-encompassing acceptance. The joined circles in the sunrays signify working together, strength in community and connection. The half circles represent the hilly region in which Mooroolbark sits. The gentle waves within the remaining rays represent the waterways and creeks within Wurundjeri country.

At the centre of the Sun is the gathering circle - the central gathering place in which people meet for respectful talking and communication. U shapes around the circle represent the students and community. Joined circles around the outer edge of the sun signify determination of spirit and self-belief.

Darrang - Tree - Green House

This proud strong tree represents Wurundjeri country - 'Wurrun' meaning the manna gumtree, and 'djeri' - the witchetty grub that lives in the tree. The roots stretch far beneath the earth pushing growth and further development. Though they are unseen, the roots are the foundation of the tree and all are needed, without one - there is no balance.

The trunk of the tree is stable and solid, it bears the markings of a powerful shield which represents strength and resilience. The wide canopy of leaves represents a nurturing and inclusive environment, even the



smallest leaf has a role to play in the tree. Every leaf is valued and respected.

The white gathering circles in the sky represent connection to community and a shared focus to stand tall like the tree.

Biik - Earth - Red House

Rich red earth is the foundation for the strength and stability of our connection to country - this is where our heart is. Each layer of dirt contributes a significant role in creating a resilient and proud environment in which all can thrive and grow, even in times of challenge. Layers within the ground represent the various pathways and journeys each student takes and comes from to form the earth. A strong-minded goanna bears the traits of the earth and is determined and resourceful - it is respectful to its surroundings and passionate with its efforts.

The circles in the sky represent unity and togetherness and the strength in community connection. The arc of U shapes across the sky signifies the students within the school and their sense of purpose to always give their best.



Discovery Centre and Administration Centre

COLLEGE CAPTAINS

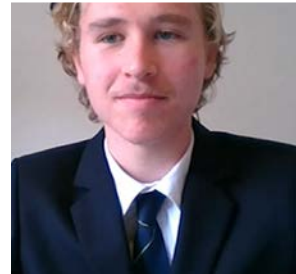

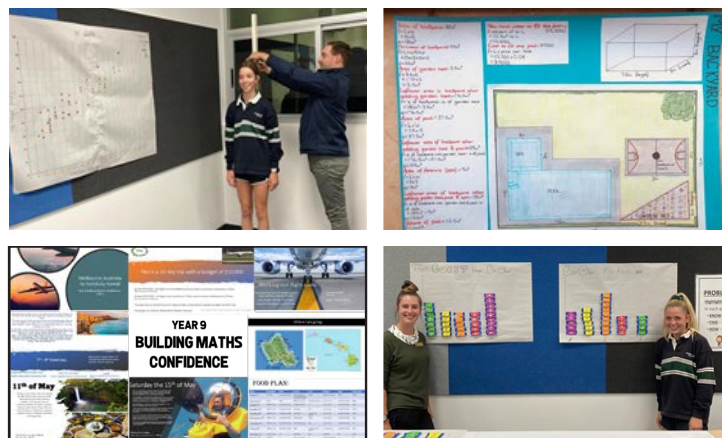

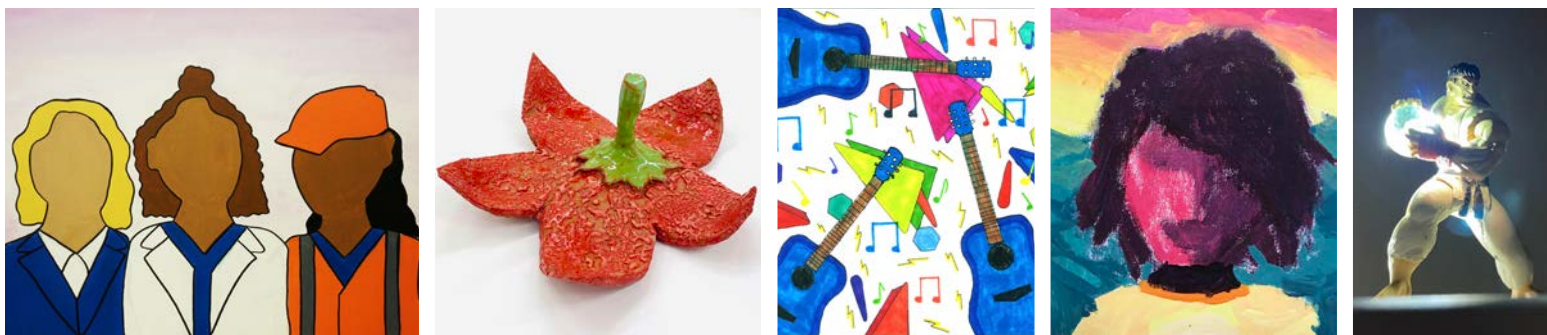

Liver: Excessive alcohol use can cause damage to the liver, and it could lead to conditions like cirrhosis (scarring to the liver) or cancer. Heart: Regular drinking increases the risk of coronary artery disease and high blood pressure, which can lead to heart failure. Stomach: Drinking too much can lead to vomiting, acid reflux, and gastritis (inflammation of the stomach), which long term can be a cause of cancer. Brain: Being drunk alters mood, impairs judgment, and concentration. Excess drinking increases your risk of having a stroke and developing dementia.	Dependency: Drinking alcohol can make you feel good, happy, and give confidence, which can lead to addiction and dependence. Anxiety & Depression: When stressed or feeling down, alcohol can initially relax someone, but after the it wears off the problems come back. Mood & Personality: Being intoxicated changes the way you think and feel, and therefore influences how you act. Poor Concentration & Judgement: As alcohol interferes with chemicals in the brain, it can make it hard for you to think clearly and make good decisions.	Risky Behaviour: Being drunk can cause a person to think irrationally and can give a false sense of confidence, which leads to risky behaviours. Violence & Aggression: Too much alcohol can make us act in ways we wouldn't normally, including making someone more angry or emotional. Embarrassment: Being drunk can lead to silly and inappropriate behaviour which can bring shame and humiliation to the drinker. Isolation: Alcohol abusers can have anti-social and poor behaviours. Sometimes people distance from this, making it a lonely time for the drunk person.

A new Year 9 subject, Be Your Own Boss, focussed on fun, business-related activities. Students developed and sold products at the Trade and Conquer market.

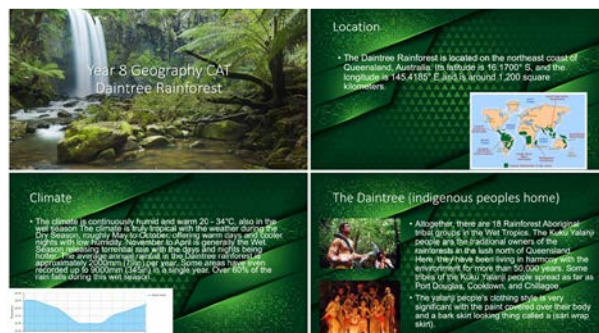

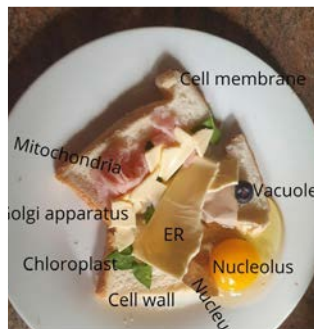

SCIENCE

We have had some fantastic learning experiences this year in Science. Some of our senior students explored biodiversity at Mt Rothwell and were given the opportunity to observe some of Australia's most threatened fauna in their natural habitat. We celebrated women and girls in Science and learnt more about the great importance in encouraging girls to enter STEM-related careers. We investigated GMOs and created fluorescent bacteria through genetic engineering. Our middle years students developed their own scientific question and performed their own independent investigations. The forensic science classes put their investigation skills to the test when they solved a mock crime at KIOSC in Wantirna.

Not all activities and experiments were performed in our Science laboratories or out on excursions. At home, students created cell models out of food and supplies they found. Ecosystems were created in glass jars from local waterways. The food webs were identified and then analysed. Students virtually visited the Melbourne Zoo to find out how animals are classified, how they adapt to their changing environment and the impact of humans on their survival. Psychology students explored their creative side and used the Gestalt Principles (principles of human perception) to help interpret visual data to create logos of their own names.

We have many more engaging activities ready to go in 2022. We wish everyone a safe and fun school holidays and look forward to seeing you next year!

Finally, we would like to say a final farewell to our year 12 students who have given so much to our Instrumental Music program.

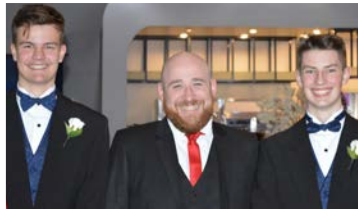
